**Today's Scripture Readings:** Parish Mass Book pp.137-9 Preface 2 p.54 Euch.Prayer 3 p.28  
Leviticus 13:1-2;44-46 It was the role of the priest to determine if a person was infected by leprosy and, if so, to protect the community from its contagion.

1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1 The Corinthians are to model their lives on Paul, their father in the faith, who models his own life on Christ.

Mark 1: 40-45 Jesus' reply, "Of course I want to", suggests that leprosy, as an effect of the work of the evil one, is to be banished from the kingdom of God. But why the reluctance to heal others? In Mark's presentation of the gospel, the true understanding of Jesus' messiahship is crucial.
