

This Sunday's Scripture Readings

Exodus 34:4-6;8-9 Moses had smashed the original stone tablets of the ten commandments after the golden calf episode. Now the Covenant is renewed.

2 Corinthians 13:11-13 This Trinitarian farewell by Paul is the origin of "the grace".

John 3:16-18 The word "only" is significant: any human may be called a son of God, but this name, and the role which goes with it, indicates a second person in God. The Holy Spirit, appears both in this conversation with Nicodemus and later in John's gospel.
